They share issues and concerns with the Principal on Friday afternoons and assist new children as they learn to become familiar with using the school bus.

Circle time offers children a practical opportunity to discuss concerns, practice positive behaviours and work out solutions and action plans in an enjoyable, fun context. When entering and exiting the school grounds we are reminding parents and visitors to our school to shut the gates. This is extremely important to ensure our children's safety whilst at school.


YEAR 4, 5 AND 6 CAMP



BACK TO SCHOOL Bus Safety Tips

When picking up or dropping off your child, wait on the same side of the road as the bus stop. Never wave or call to a child from across the road. Dress your child in bright clothing.

Have a 'plan B' in case you are running late.

Teach your child to:

- Stand well back from the road when waiting for the bus.
- Wait for the bus to stop completely before getting on or off.
- Wait until the bus has gone before crossing the road.



BACK TO SCHOOL Road Safety Tips

School gates are busy places.

- Drive slowly near the school. Children can be unpredictable so be prepared for the unexpected.
- Do not stop or park on yellow lines they are there to protect your children.
- Take care to look for cyclists before opening your door.
- Always make sure your child exits onto the footpath.
- Never wave or call to your child from across the road.



BACK TO SCHOOL Road Safety Tips

School gates are busy places.

Help relieve congestion and create a safer environment by walking to school or parking well away from the gate.

If your children are younger, park a few hundred metres away and walk with them so they can learn about road safety with you.

NEVER park on a bus stop, cycle lane or yellow lines outside a school, even for 30 seconds. It only takes seconds for a child to be injured
