Room 7...

After weeks of work we have finally completed our Writing Across New Zealand project. This has taken many hours of discussion and we even sent them some sheep wool and a lavender bag. The school we wrote to was Wakaaranga School in Auckland. We sent them lots of information about where we live. We had to draw a secret map of our classroom, put a dot in the map of where our parents came from, we sent them an oak leaf from our big oak tree, explain some cool places in our school, add up the number of siblings we all had, etc etc. Check it out.

Room 2...

The children have been working really hard this week in our reading programme. They have been practising writing their spelling words by doing Rainbow Writing and they have also been making their sight words in many different ways during word work. This encourages the children to practice reading the words, think about the sounds in words and how to form letters correctly. We have also been writing some awesome stories and trying to underline words we write that we aren't sure of.

The children have also been gaining reading mileage by spending time reading to themselves and reading with a buddy. Everyone in Room 2 knows two different ways to read a book - talk with your child and they might be able to show you at home.

We thought this might be helpful when having conversations with your child about incidents that may occur with other people.
